...during this last tour of Australia and New Zealand he and his band performed to packed arenas in 9 cities across both countries. Performing classics such as Father & Son, Morning has Broken and Wild World, crowds sang along and enjoyed his latest songs from critically acclaimed, Grammy-nominated album **"Laughing Apple."** From that tour, and through his UK based charity 'Peace Train' Yusuf was able to support several worthwhile projects in Australia, including: emergency supplies to fire brigades and communities in need during the 2019/20 bushfires; supplying books to children in remote communities in East Arnhem Land; delivering hay to farmers during the drought in NSW; and supporting cancer research and patient care through the Olivia Newton-John Wellness Centre in Melbourne.


In 2020 the Peace Train Water Project installed 12 water panels to provide clean, safe, free drinking water to the community. Water created by the panels is absorbed from moisture in the air, and unlike ground/bore water, is free from any sediment or other impurities. They do not require any external power, and very little maintenance. The Peace Train Water Panels are open for all community members, and we encourage everyone young and old to take advantage of this free resource.
